33% of the Liverpool City Region is important for nature conservation - that's a staggering 30,397 hectares! Internationally important and highly-protected coastal sites and estuaries are 23% of our City Region. But, a lot of land has no protection at all and is vulnerable despite being vital for the survival of many different species and habitats.
